BACKGROUND

St. Louis Regional Freight Study

Commissioned by the East-West Gateway Council of Governments in 2013, evaluated existing capabilities, gaps and potential for growth in freight

Study highlighted potential impact of freight to economic development, and importance of public sector involvement

Recommendations include establishment of a Regional Freight District

REGIONAL EFFORT

Unprecedented Regional Support

Elected leaders from Illinois and Missouri recognize the importance of freight, and provided full support to East-West Gateway Board of Directors

Creation of Regional Freight Working Group and Freightway Alliance brings together elected officials, public organizations and the private sector

All parties are working together to leverage resources for freight growth and economic development – **collaboration instead of division**

Measuring **Success**

In the process of developing key performance indicators that will demonstrate how the Freightway is reaching objectives:

- 3. Develop marketing strategies that focus on **local and regional** markets, and more broadly to **national and international** markets


REAL ESTATE OPPORTUNITIES

FREIGHT DEVELOPMENT PROJECT LIST

Purpose

Identify and **prioritize** multimodal transportation projects and freight infrastructure improvements that will:

- Drive economic growth
- Raise awareness and support for funding
- Increase efficiency, reliability, capacity and level of service
- Help increase productivity and competitiveness

SELECTION CRITERIA

Primary Criteria

- Economic Impact
- Multimodal Impact
- Efficiency Impact

Secondary Criteria

- Strategic Alignment
- Business Development Impact
- Public Safety

FREIGHT DEVELOPMENT PROJECT LIST

Evaluation

More than 20 regional multimodal transportation projects and improvements were evaluated against the selection criteria

Final list will be incorporated into Needs Analysis and Freight Development Plans scheduled for completion this fall

Six projects have been given the highest priority, including projects that are nationally significant and specifically address 'first mile/last mile' transportation needs

SELECTED PROJECTS

Highest Priority

Merchants Rail Bridge Replacement

- 126-year old rail bridge that spans the Mississippi River
- Connections to six Class I railroads
- Currently carries more than 40 million gross tons annually
- Total estimated project cost = \$222 million

Interstate 270 Mississippi River Bridge Replacement

- Replacement of two existing structures
- Construction of new structure to accommodate forecasted vehicle/ freight flow
- Total estimated project cost = \$160 \$175 million

SELECTED PROJECTS

Highest Priority

Interstate 270 Improvements

- Increase capacity by widening to six lanes from Lilac Ave. to IL-111
- Estimated cost = \$350 \$400 million
- Corridor improvements between Lilac Ave. to Lindbergh Blvd.
- Estimated cost = \$243 million

North Riverfront Commerce Corridor Improvements

- Improve mobility and circulation issues in 3,000 acre multimodal logistics and business district
- Total estimated cost = \$55 million

SELECTED PROJECTS

Highest Priority

Relocate IL Route 3 in St. Clair County, Illinois

- Improve access to I-70, Stan Musial Veteran's Memorial Bridge,
 Sauget Industrial Park and St. Louis Downtown Airport
- New construction between East St. Louis and Sauget
- Estimated cost = \$125 million (two lanes) or \$170 million (4 lanes)

Falling Springs Diversion Loop/IL Route 3 Railroad Bypass

- Construction of bypass loop from IL Route 3 over A&S railroad in Sauget to eliminate substantial through-traffic delays
- Total estimated cost = \$20 \$25 million

FUNDING OPPORTUNITIES

FASTLANE

- East-West Gateway Freight Study
- Merchants Bridge: public-private partnership with Bi-State Development, Terminal Railroad Association, MoDOT
